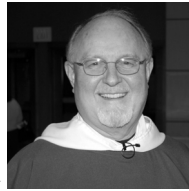

All come to the same Welcome Table and receive the same Lord and Savior. Our color, age, and gender all come together to make a beautiful mosaic, the One Body of Christ.

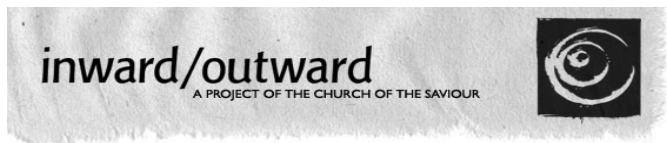

My Dear Sisters and Brothers,

When asked to assist All Saints with the need of one of our African parishioners dealing with tragedy, Saint John Vianney came to our rescue. In May 2006, one of our parishioners drowned in a swimming pool and has been in a coma since. His entire family still lived in the Congo in Africa, including his mother. Upon hearing the news of her son's drowning and coma, Colette immediately began the process to visit her son in the United States and arrived later in 2006.

Colette expressed the need for her husband to also visit with their son. Of course, we understood. Our staff and the Congolese community began the lengthy process of assisting with the transition of her husband's arrival to the United States, which included contacting both Senators and Congresswoman for support letters to obtain a Visa for the sole purpose of visiting their ill child.

We have moved the couple into the rectory. They are comfortable and very happy to be here visiting with their son, who is still in a coma. This family can always use your assistance with bus passes, which are \$16 per week, or money for food. Because of their diet, they shop at an exclusive African grocery store.

Please welcome Marcel, Colette's husband, to our parish. We are very happy to have them worship with us and be of assistance in every way that God allows us.

Thank you for your continued support of our outreach ministries and mission to serve the poor and the powerless.
