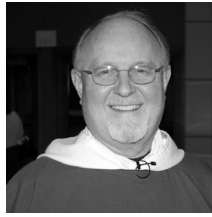

Dear Sisters and Brothers,



One of the books I am reading is called *Churches that Make a Difference*, by Ronald Sider, Philip Olson and Heidi Rolland Unruh. The subtitle is: Reaching Your Community with Good News and Good Works. That is the challenge that we face here in our Beloved Community; how do we put the “Good News” and “Good Works” together?

Leadership is critical. And there are qualities that leadership must have for the kind of holistic ministry that we envision here at All Saints. And these qualities or characteristics come about in “a mysterious process that blends divine grace and human response. As leaders respond in faith to God’s calling, the Holy Spirit ‘superintends, empowers, equips, gifts, guides, directs, disciplines, provides insight and delegates the authority to lead.’ And these gifts are not meant for the pastor only, but for all the leaders who share in the ministry and mission of the church.”

The book lists ten essential qualities of a holistic ministry leader. Today we will speak about the first quality: Committed Discipleship. “Before people are leaders, they are disciples of Christ. To lead people in loving their neighbors, leaders must love God with their whole heart, soul, mind, and strength (Mk 12:30-31). They must have a growing faith, sound doctrine, and an earnest prayer life. And they must be able to discern the Holy Spirit’s leading. Following Jesus’ example, good leaders carve out time to spend alone with God, renewing their commitment and listening for the still, small voice

of the Spirit. ‘God does not shout God’s best vision through hassled Christian living. It is in the quiet that God gives the most delivering visions of life.’ Personal spiritual renewal is the pillar upholding a leader’s public ministry.

The spiritual vitality of a leader is contagious. Others will be drawn to drink from the same living-giving well that sustains a leader’s compassion, witness, and enthusiasm for the church’s mission.

A leader’s vulnerability and transparency can reinforce the congregation’s confidence. People need to know their leaders share the struggles, temptations, and heartaches of ministry. Trust in a leader’s character, motives, spiritual maturity, and obedience to God’s leading eases a congregation’s natural resistance to change.”

As our members know, I am a flawed and often times un-worthy servant who has been blessed with the graces of the ordained priesthood. It is my deep and unswerving desire to be the kind of leader that does inspire others to hear the Good News and do the Good Works! I am grateful for the abundance of men and women at this church who have stood with me as we continue to be faithful to the call of a good and gracious God.
