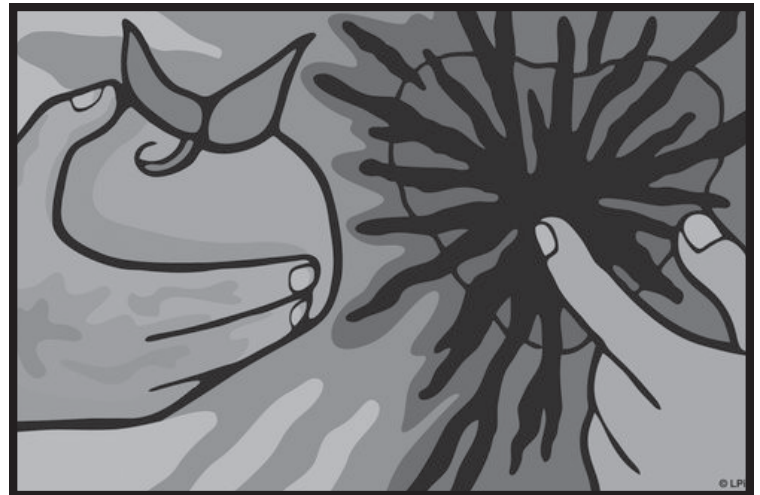

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

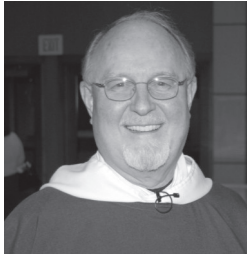
The Parish Council met last Tuesday. We spent the majority of time on our capital campaigns—The Unity in Christ Fund and the Archdiocesan campaign, Faith In Our Future. The consultant supplied by the Archdiocese met with us and helped us rethink the two campaigns and how we can join the two campaigns in order to move forward to meet our new goal of \$350,000.00 over the next three years. Sixty percent of the money raised as part of Faith In Our Future Campaign will come back to us to help reduce our debt, and there is a possibility that an even greater percentage might come back to the parish. We can say more about that in a few weeks. Our monthly loan payment is \$7400.00.

As many members are now completing their commitment to Unity In Christ, we are asking them for a new commitment to Faith In Our Future. We knew that when we completed our building project we would need to continue to raise a significant amount of money over and above what we are receiving for ministry and mission. And this commitment will need to continue until the debt is eliminated.

I ask you, whether you participated in the Unity In Christ Fund or not, to please be a part of the Faith In Our Future Campaign. We will be ready to move to the pledge phase of the campaign within a few weeks. If you have already pledged to the Faith In Our Future, please accept my gratitude.

I thank Marvin Pratt, Arlisia Henry and Charles Matthews for their continuing leadership in the Faith In Our Future effort. I hope others will join them as we intensify our efforts to raise the money to eliminate our debt.

While we are concentrating our efforts on getting all of our members to be donors to the Faith In Our Future Campaign, we are also looking at other ways to eliminate our debt in ten



years or less. One way will be, hopefully, the Community Based Residential Facility that we are planning to open at 3717 W. Keefe Avenue. Pray for the success of this venture. A portion of the revenue would be used to pay down the debt.

As summer winds down, I ask you to consider becoming more active at All Saints. Please join our 12-week bible study. Become a liturgical minister: Lector, acolyte, choir member, Eucharistic minister, or hospitality minister. We need you now. May God Bless you and your family.
