Dear Sisters and Brothers,



You know what it would be like if you missed a paycheck for a month or two? What would have to go? Food? Clothing? Heat? Lights? Or maybe you are in a position where you do not count on current income to maintain your lifestyle. Most of us need the monthly check, and so does our church! It is not only your household that depends on your income to keep the lights and heat on! Your church depends on you.

I'm told Bishop Perry would say "You do not pay for the Gospel, but you do need to pay for the pipeline that gets it to you." And that "pipeline" is getting more expensive each year. So the question is, has your contribution gone up each year to meet the higher costs of the pipeline? Our heat and light bill alone is staggering! And our winter weather puts other strains on our income—salt, snow removal, additional cleaning of all our buildings.

And when you are not here, the costs continue. While I was on vacation I thought of this. And since I give my tithe through Electronic Funds Transfer, I was contributing to All Saints Catholic Church even while I was out of town. The heat, the lights, the staff salaries, all need to be paid each month, whether you are with us or not. For those of you who do not use EFT, I would prayerfully ask that you make up the income not given when you are not here and factor that into your giving when you are here. It is simply a matter of counting the Sundays you are away and adding those Sundays to your contribution. You will feel good and so will we!

And all of this is done because we are Christians and have a responsibility to give generously to our church. The U.S. Bishops said: "Stewardship plays an important role in the lives of the people who seek to be stewards of their personal vocations, for it is these which show how, according to the circumstances of their individual lives, God wants them to cherish and serve a broad range of interests and concerns: life and health, along with their own intellec-

tual and spiritual well being and that of others; material goods and resources; the natural environment; the cultural heritage of humankind—indeed, the whole rich panoply of human goods, both those already realized and those whose realization depends upon the present generation or upon generations yet to come, **Catholics have a duty, too, to be stewards of their church: that community of disciples, that body of Christ, of which they, individually and together, are the members**, and in which 'if one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share in the joy.' (1 Cor 12:26)

Please be generous in your giving, especially to your parish. God bless you for all you do to help secure the financial stability of All Saints Catholic Church!
