By giving the poor food to eat, a home to have a good night's sleep, and other bare essential needs, we are only scratching the surface of what we can do as Catholics. St. John Vianney, Three Holy Women, St. Francis Borgia, Blessed Trinity, St. Monica, and St. Mary of the Hill assist us with our meal program every month. They also give donations to All Saints Commons, our home for homeless women and children.

We are so blessed to have so many friends who understand the needs of the poor. And I am very proud to be a part of a wonderful beloved community that serves our extended family, the forgotten and the invisible: God's people.
