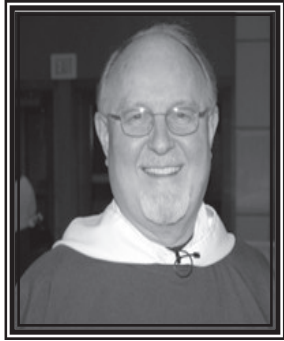

# All Saints Catholic Church



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Why do we exist as a parish? When we look at the reality of our local church, All Saints, we can be tempted to say is it worth it? As pastor, I feel the tension between the realities on the ground, and what “ought” to be. I am constantly asking myself, as we struggle with our own selfishness and our great ability to trivialize what it means to be a Catholic Christian, how can we bring God’s Reign more fully into our midst?

The definition of church provided in *Catholicism* by Richard P. McBrien is: *The Church is the whole body, or congregation, of persons who are called by God the Father to acknowledge the Lordship of Jesus, the Son, in word, in sacrament, in witness, and in service, and, through the power of the Holy Spirit, to collaborate with Jesus’ historic mission for the sake of the Kingdom of God.*

The Mission/Vision statement that has been part of our parish life for a long time and is repeated in the weekly bulletin, I think, captures what we “ought” to do to be faithful to our membership in Christ. Please read the statement and ask yourself if your participation in the life of All Saints strengthens our faithfulness to it. When you joined All Saints, you became at that moment an “essential” part of our mission and ministry.

For All Saints to be faithful to our calling, we need to be people of prayer and loving service to others. Let me strongly suggest you do something that, over time, will greatly strengthen the

mission and ministry here: 1) Spend ten minutes in the morning and evening in prayer, 2) Frequently examine your life, 3) Worship weekly with your church family, and, 4) Choose a specific activity that shows your commitment to social justice. These four pillars will not only strengthen you, but will also strengthen your faith community since we are in this together.

Pentecost Sunday is celebrated on June 12. This gives us a special opportunity to be renewed in the Spirit. My hope and prayer is that All Saints can truly be the Presence of the Living God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit in our community and beyond.

## Humanizing Empire

We have to go back to Jesus of Nazareth and ask: How does he go on humanizing this imperial world?

Most fundamentally he challenges us to give priority to mercy; without it, nothing else has any meaning. His honesty toward reality, his will to truth, his judgment on the situation of the oppressed majorities and the oppressive minorities, his call to be the voice of the voiceless against those who have too much voice. His reaction to that reality: defending the weak, denouncing and unmasking the oppressors. His faithfulness in upholding honor and justice to the very end, in the face of internal crises and external persecutions. His freedom to bless and curse, to go to the synagogue on the Sabbath but also to place human beings ahead of the Sabbath; in short, his freedom to let nothing stop him from doing good.

His vision of an end to the misfortunes of the poor and happiness (therefore, blessedness) for his followers. His embrace of sinners and the marginalized, his sitting at the table and celebrating with them, his joy over God's self-revelation to them. His signs--only modest signs of the kingdom--and his utopian horizon that took in the whole society, the world and history. And finally, his trust in a good God, close by, whom he called Father, while at the same time he remained attentive to the Father who is God, the unmanageable mystery.

These are marks of the anti-imperial spirit. They hold up to us the *ecce homo*, "behold the man," and invite us to go beyond the imperial arrogance of *civis romanus sum*, "I am a citizen of the empire."
