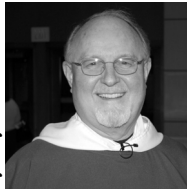

Dear Sisters and Brothers,



Today, May 25, 2008, we are celebrating the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Ordination to the Priesthood of Father Bryan Massingale, a member of our parish and priest of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Father Bryan is currently on the faculty of the Theology Department of Marquette University. Congratulations to Father Bryan .

Father Bryan became an ordained priest 25 years ago. But he became a “priest” when he received the Sacrament of Baptism. All of us become “priests” when we go down into the waters of Baptism and come up and are anointed with the Holy Chrism as priest, prophet and king (or queen). “We are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in the mission of the Church. The Baptismal call is a call to holiness, to be constantly aware of God’s presence in our lives. God calls us to community, to be part of a family and a parish, and the entire human community around the world. God also calls us to service, to care for the poor and the vulnerable and to be a voice for the voiceless.” (The Catechism of the Catholic Church)

Among the many graces that come with our Baptism, one grace is to be part of a “community” of faith. Some will say to us that they don’t need a church. They say that the members of the church, any church, are hypocrites, sinners, people who talk the talk but don’t walk the walk. They say they read their bible and pray in secret. They miss the point that we don’t receive our Baptismal call ALONE. We are called to community. God wants us to love and be loved, to support and be supported by others who share our journey to God. And, yes, we are a church of sinners, always realizing that we, above all, need the forgiveness of God and our brothers and sisters. We are going to God together or not at all, forgiving and being forgiven. We who are members of All Saints are so blessed to have a community that seeks reconciliation and forgiveness and is willing to forgive and be

reconciled with all our brothers and sisters. That is the blessing that comes from our Baptism.

We are a community of priests, prophets and kings or queens, anointed by God to serve and spend our lives for others. And some of us have received that special anointing as ordained priests. And they come among us as servant leaders giving themselves for the service of all, especially the poor and powerless. Thank God for priests like Fr. Bryan. May we have other young men come forward now and begin their journey to the ordained priesthood.

### Human Concerns Corner

The following places are good places to work and hire on a regular basis.

**Milwaukee County**-Go to the County’s Human Resource Department. 901 N. 9th St., 2nd Floor. There are 4 bulletin boards of job postings. Ask the human resources office for the job title you are interested in. They do not accept resumes. Some of the postings include lifeguards, snack bar employees, Administrative Assistants, Secretarial Assistants, Accountants, Nurses, Word Clerks. Check the boards each week for postings.

**Pick-Save** -Go to the East Point Pick-N-Save on the corner of Van Buren and Lyon or the Metro Market on the corner of Juneau and Van Buren. The positions available are stock clerks and cashiers as well as deli and hot food employees. You apply on a computer in the store.

**Target**-Target has you apply on a computer in the store too.

**Downtown Hotels**-The Pfister, Hilton, Hyatt and Doubletree are all union hotels. They work with the Wisconsin Regional Training partnership to give you basic life skills if you are not working and need to brush up on skills before you begin working. The hotels are based on seniority, which allows you to bid on positions within the hotels. You may start out in banquets or housekeeping but can then bid up to the best paying jobs in the house-the bell persons and valet employees (the tips are very good).

Keep in mind that you will get hired sooner if you mark that you are available all hours and all days and all shifts on the application. After you are hired you can negotiate better hours or positions.

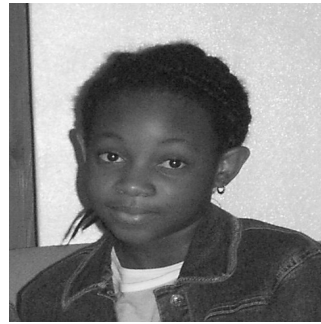
