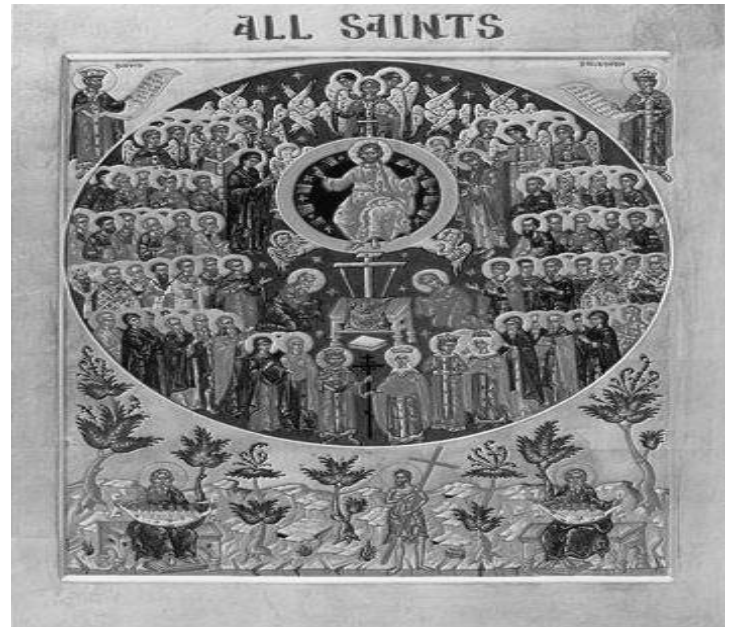

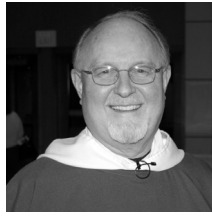

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last Sunday a parishioner approached me after mass with a big smile on her face and some big news—she had gotten a job and yes, she would now be able to “tithe,” she said. This wonderful woman had spoken to me a number of times over the last month or so about her inability to contribute to the mission of the church and how sad that made her feel. She has been an inspiration for me. I asked myself when did I last increase my financial gift to the mission and ministry at All Saints. It has been at least two years!



Since then I have received a salary increase and never thought about increasing my giving. That is sad, but we do it all the time, don't we? We (I) seldom take the time to look at our financial resources and consider just how much (how little!) we are giving to our church--the community that has the most direct relationship to our spiritual lives and wellbeing, the “Body of Christ” to which we belong in a miraculous way.

I will increase my monthly financial gift to All Saints, while I also continue to contribute to the Unity In Christ Fund, as I pledge. This will be good for me and the church will be blessed as I am blessed.

I am very conscious of the need for more revenue at All Saints if we are to continue our wonderful ministries and at the same time pay our ordinary expenses like salaries, light and heat. The Finance Committee met last Tuesday and looked at our financial statement for July through October and the bottom line is nowhere close to where it should be. One of the most significant realities is that our ordinary income from weekly/monthly contributions is down from last year at this time. When the committee saw that, the wind was taken out of our sails. This should not be happening at a vibrant parish with significant ministries and a growing membership roster.

Because we are “just making it” and are not able to put any money away for a rainy day, our Archbishop has come to our aid—not with money

but with a series of moves that we hope will get us out of the ditch over the next 4-6 months. Father Michael Barrett, the pastor of Blessed Trinity Parish on the north side, has agreed to serve as a financial manager for a period of months while we secure the financial base of the parish. I am very excited about Fr. Michael's willingness to work with me to help us to be good stewards of our parish so that we can not only continue our ministries but increase them as Jesus would do. Please consider increasing your gift to our beloved community.

To Be Poor

To be poor, sadly, is still to be without a voice and without power.... The very phrase, 'the poor,' lumps together and depersonalizes billions of individuals with different unique stories and voices which are seldom heard, because the rich and powerful shout more loudly. It can be tempting for those attracted by Franciscan simplicity to rhapsodize about the ennobling properties of poverty. This is dangerously patronizing.

It is important to understand that there is an essential difference between poverty as a chosen, life-giving option and the poverty which denies and dehumanizes. Living in unchosen poverty does not ennoble. Instead of freeing the mind from 'distractions' about food and clothes and other material concerns, they become an obsession. Far from being set free to live abundantly, this kind of poverty concentrates the mind on the mechanics of blind survival. A poor person is not necessarily any freer from materialism than the rich; they merely have less opportunity to indulge their desires. For the sake of clarity, then, it is necessary to draw a distinction between involuntary poverty, and a choice (or vocation) to live in simplicity in defiance of a world which defines us by what we have.
