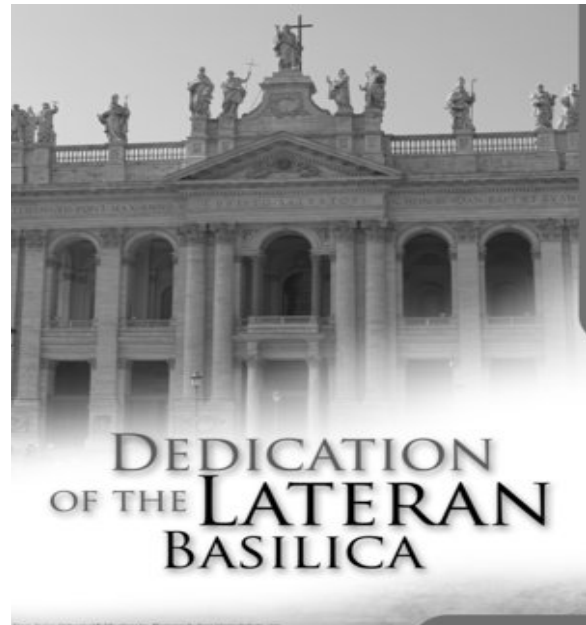

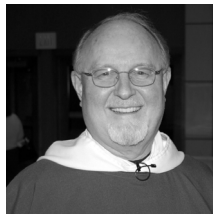

## JUSTICE BULLETIN BOARD

"Brothers and sisters, you are God's building...and the Spirit of God dwells in you."  
(1 Corinthians 3:9c, 16)

As Catholics, we believe, and have been taught by our Popes and Bishops that we are called to be Church, to be pathways of grace for each other and to be the "image of God" to all with whom we share life. We believe that if our beautiful worship space, our Cathedral, were to disappear, that we would still be "church".

One way to understand today's first reading is that we quench our own thirst when we gather together to worship, to pray, to learn, to serve, to teach, and to celebrate. But the "water", representing God's life and grace does not only remain with us. We carry it with us into the everyday world of our lives, and so the "water" flows in all directions.

In the fall of 1993, the US Catholic Bishops published a document call "Communities of Salt and Light". They begin the document with the words: "The parish is where the Church lives. Parishes are communities of faith, of action, and of hope. They are where the gospel is proclaimed and celebrated, where believers are formed and sent to renew the earth. Parishes are the home of the Christian community; they are the heart of our Church."

Later in the document the Bishops say: "We have much to learn from those parishes that are leading the way in making social ministry an integral part of parish ministry and evangelization. We need to build local communities of faith where our social teaching is central, not fringe; where social ministry is integral, not optional; where it is the work of every believer, not just the mission of a few committed people and committees.

The parishes that are leaders in this area see social ministry not as a specialized ministry, but as an integral part of the entire parish. They weave the Catholic social mission into every aspect of parish life-worship, formation, and action."

## FAITH BOOK

Mini-reflections on the Sunday scripture readings designed for persons on the run. "Faith Book" is also brief enough to be posted in the Sunday parish bulletins people take home.

### From today's Ezekiel reading:

I saw waters flowing out from beneath the threshold of the temple toward the east.... Wherever the river flows, every sort of living creature can multiply and live, and there shall be abundant fish, for wherever this water comes the sea shall be made fresh.

### Reflection:

Today we acknowledge the ministries, the "living waters," that flow from our "temple," our parish community. We celebrate those who: visit the sick and elderly; minister in jails and prisons; deliver food to poor families; Christmas carolers who sing at hospitals during the holidays; teenage and young adult groups who make yearly visits to serve in poor areas; eucharistic ministers who take communion to the homebound, etc. These and many others like them, are the fruitful and healing "living waters" that flow from the temple.

### So we ask ourselves:

In what ways do I experience "living waters" flowing from the temple of my parish community? What part do I play in these life-giving and healing ministries?
