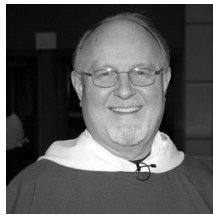
Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The Feast of Christ the King ends our liturgical year. Next Sunday we will start our year over with the Season of Advent. On this feast of Christ the King, we are given a Gospel text that is always troubling. We hear Jesus say that our lives will have meaning and our passing out of this life will be glorious only if we find Jesus now in the poor and the powerless. The challenge is for all of us all the time. Our world is teeming with our poor brothers and sisters who need food, clothing, clean water, decent housing, and visits if they are imprisoned. Jesus did not direct his message to a chosen few—but to all of us. And the way we hear His message is going to be the way we live and share or don't share.

That is why I hold our outreach ministries in such high regard. No matter what happens at the parish, we know that when we are serving hungry people, housing homeless women and children, and inviting all to the Welcome Table, we are actively engaged in the fundamental command of Jesus. This past week alone I was able to significantly improve the lives of those who came to me seeking financial assistance. Your gift to the Collection for the Poor makes that possible since we use no money that is given for the regular operations of the church.

As we begin a New Year liturgically, can we agree to make the mandate of Jesus our mandate? We can not slow down in our desire to serve those who come to us in need. The times we are living in are tough especially for the poor, the unemployed, the sick, and the folks on the margins of our society. Let us commit to place them at the center of our life at All Saints.

And for us, Jesus has a rich reward for our ministry done in His name. We not only have the great realization that we are truly making the mission of Jesus a reality but we also can see with our own eyes how our helping hand can change people's lives. Come, participate in our outreach ministries and maybe suggest others that we should be doing and aren't. Together our Beloved Community can stand for something that is at the heart of God's heart—the



poor, the oppressed, the weak in our society.

## Thanksgiving Eve Bread Exchange

Please join us at the mass Wednesday, November 26th at 6:30 pm. We ask that each family bring a loaf of your favorite bread (sweet, fancy or plain) and attach a piece of paper with your name and telephone number. At the end of the mass, we will exchange bread and the family who receives your bread will call you and wish you a Happy Thanksgiving. You should then call the family you received bread from and wish them a Happy Thanksgiving. Tables will be set up in the front of church. Place the bread on the table when you arrive.

## Foster Care

In Milwaukee County, there is a shortage of foster homes. Because of the limited number of homes, children may have to travel as far as two hours away from Milwaukee in order to find a safe and loving foster home placement. Bethany Christian Services, in conjunction with Children's Service Society, is looking for assessment foster homes for children, ages newborn to eleven years. These children require temporary care, thirty to forty days, until their cases are adjudicated and it is determined whether they will be placed in long-term foster care or returned to their parents.

This is an ideal ministry for an assessment home provider who works part-time or is a stay at home parent. This ministry provides financial compensation and support from Bethany Christian Services.

The Wisconsin Well Woman Program (WWWP) provides preventative health screenings to women with little or no health insurance coverage. Well Woman pays for mammograms, Pap tests and other health screenings. Services are available at no cost through health care providers. There is no premium, co-payment or deductible.

To be eligible you must be a woman age 45 through 64 and meet income eligibility guidelines:
