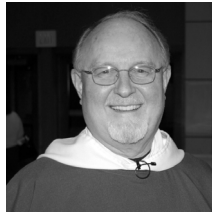
Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Election Day is just a few weeks away. The outcome of this election is going to have tremendous consequences for all of us.

That is why we need to inform ourselves so that our vote will not only be for our own self-interest but for the good of everyone in our country—the poor, the uninsured, the voiceless children and men and women who are living in fear of the future. We need to be concerned about those fathers and mothers who are not able to feed their children from the sweat of their own brow, not able to provide health care so they must see their children or parents and friends suffer needlessly without the medical care that many of us take for granted. Some of you reading this message are uninsured. Our vote should also be for you.

We need to be concerned about the unborn and the mothers carrying babies in their wombs. We need to ask ourselves what would help prevent any child from being aborted. How would treating the mother with more love and providing social services and financial assistance make it less likely that she will abort? We need to be concerned about the “abortion” of the born—those little helpless babies who come into the world without a fighting chance of growing up healthy or living to old age. This is what we are voting for.

In our preparation to vote we need to form our consciences and vote for the person who best represents our Christian values. The bishops tell us that because no candidate is fully on board with Catholic Social Teaching, we need to examine their record and their promises. We are told we cannot vote for a pro-choice candidate if that is the REASON for voting for that person. We can, however, vote for a pro-choice candidate if we see other positive social justice issues being addressed by that candidate. This position of the bishops helps put to rest the “single-issue” con-



cept that has prevented many from voting for the candidate of their choice.

I hope this has been helpful. Please vote.
